

**RULES OF CONDUCT
QUECHAN TRIBAL COURT
FORT YUMA INDIAN RESERVATION**

DURING COURT PROCEEDINGS, THE FOLLOWING RULES
SHALL BE ADHERED TO:

1. No firearms, weapons or electronic devices are allowed in the courtroom
2. No food, beverages, chewing gum, smoking, or chewing tobacco is allowed
3. Remove all hats and sunglasses (prescription only)
4. Joking, laughing, running around or other disruptive behavior is prohibited
5. Cell phones must be turned off.
6. Proper attire must be worn at all times:
 - a. Revealing clothing including but not limited to halter tops, shorts, mini skirts, low cut blouses, tank tops are not allowed.
7. Children are not allowed in the courtroom unless requested by the Court. Parents are responsible for the conduct and behavior of their minor children.
8. Out burst, argumentative behavior, use of profane language, (unless by the Presiding Judge) threats or acts of intimidation are prohibited.

ALL PARTIES SHALL MAINTAIN RESPECT TO THE COURT,
THE JUDGE, COURT STAFF AND ONE ANOTHER.

ANY PERSON VIOLATING THE ABOVE RULES OF CONDUCT,
OR CAUSING ANY DISTURBANCE OR INTERRUPTING COURT
PROCEEDING IS SUBJECT TO:

- REMOVAL FROM THE COURT ROOM
- MAY BE FOUND IN DIRECT CONTEMPT OF COURT AND SUBJECT TO ARREST, FINES AND/OR IMPRISONMENT.
